How to Get There

From Cleveland Area: Most of you will come through Columbus. From Columbus: Take I-71 S to Exit 17B to merge onto I-275 W toward I-75. Take exit 39 for Winton Rd. Keep right at the fork, follow signs for Forest Park/Greenhills and merge onto Winton Rd and travel about 0.8 miles. Turn right onto W. Kemper Rd and the destination will be on the left.

From Toledo and Dayton: Take I-75 S to Exit 16 to merge onto I-275 W toward i_74/Indianapolis. Take exit 39 for Winton Rd. Keep right at the fork, follow signs for Forest Park/Greenhills and merge onto Winton Rd and travel about 0.8 miles. Turn right onto W Kemper Rd and the destination will be on the left.

From SE Ohio: Google Maps says there's only a 5 minute difference in going to Columbus and following the Cleveland area directions, or going across 32 to 35 to I-71 or taking the Appalachian Highway all the way to I-275 N via the ramp to I-71/Columbus. Keep left to continue on I-275 W to Exit 39 for Winton Rd. Keep right at the fork, follow signs for Forest Park/Greenhills and merge onto Winton Rd and travel about 0.8 miles. Turn right onto W Kemper Rd and the destination will be on the left.

Workshops and Presenters

The Ohio Association of Parliamentarians is pleased to announce the Workshops and Presenters for their 2017 Annual Session. The 2017 Annual Session will be held in Forest Park, Ohio (Cincinnati area) on Friday, May 19, 2017. This Year's Theme is "Stepping to the Rhythm of Robert: Revise-Amend-Recommend"

1. BYLAW REVISION - Jim Williams, PRP

In drafting and amending an organization's major governance document-the Bylaws-mistakes are made and perpetuated. The document may lack critical details, be ambiguous because of word choices or punctuation, or may be out of date. The assembly has the ability to correct all of these and other flaws through the art of revision. Just as one does not take up a paint brush for the first time and create a Caravaggio masterpiece, the revision procedure requires skill, study, and practice. This presentation will introduce the critical aspects of bylaw revision.

2. WAYS TO AMEND - Myra Myers, PRP

The presenter will go through three simple forms of amendment and amend the amendment.

3. RESOLVED, THAT... Barbara Whitaker, RP

This lesson will discuss why a resolution may be a better choice than a "regular" motion, how to form resolutions, revise them and recommend amendments, as well as when to use them. The parts of a resolution and the alternate wording forms will also be discussed. Also discussed will be various types of resolutions, committees, and examples of the process of moving a resolution through the stages of adoption and revision. Attendees will also learn about what happens to a resolution once it is adopted.

4. NAP MEMBERSHIP—HOW TO STUDY FOR and TAKE THE MEMBERSHIP EXAMINATION - Patricia A. Koch, PRP

Participants will understand the National Association of Parliamentarians (NAP) requirements for membership—the examination and payment of dues. The presenter will also discuss the Study Guide and RONR in Brief.

5. WHAT ROBERTS DOESN'T SAY ABOUT PRESENTATIONS - Edward Magiste

Frequently, members of OAP are called upon to teach various aspects of parliamentary procedure to groups, including other parliamentarians as well as members of organizations. In today's technologically based environment, learning has placed new demands on presenters. This workshop will help those who conduct workshops on parliamentary procedure to enhance their overall presenting skills and make better use of activities to increase learning transfer for attendees.
